IN MILITARY CIRCLES

FRUIT IS WASTING. Distress in Bahamas Owing to the War. New York, Nov. 26.—The good people of the Bahamas are showered with all kinds of fruit falling from the trees like autumn leaves and rotting on the ground as a result of the war in the old world, according to Bishop W. R. Honby and his chaplain, H. W. Weigall, who arrived here yesterday on the steamship Vigilance.

Conditions in the islands are extremely bad," said Bishop Honby, "because of this war. Thousands of laborers are idle and there is considerable financial distress. Germany was our best customer in the sale of sponges. Since war was declared the sponge trade is at a standstill and sponge fishermen who hook the sponges on the banks of the Bahamas are idle; nothing for them to do but to get up in the morning and go to bed at night and pray for better times. I do wish the United States would permit our fruits to come into your country free from duty. It would aid us greatly. Millions of oranges are rotting, as well as other fruits, because there are no steamers leaving the islands, and it is impossible for our people to pay duty on fruits."

TRAIN OF GERMAN DEAD.—Thirty Carriages Each Held One Hundred Corpses. London, Nov. 26.—A traveller just arrived from Belgium, who is according to the Daily Mail, "his position gives him exceptional opportunity for observation," tells the following story as illustrative of the awful nature of the German losses in that country: "At Ghent the other day a friend of mine was on a railway bridge on which a German military train had stopped. He noticed that all the blinds were down and asked the German sentinel on the bridge for the reason. Without a word the sentinel opened one of the carriage doors. A ghastly sight met their gaze. The carriage, an ordinary first-class compartment, was filled to the roof with German corpses, naked, and their socks. In every carriage there were one hundred bodies, and the train had thirty carriages."

FORGOT WINTER'S ARRIVAL. Ontario Farmer's Product Gifts Reach Here Frozen. Ottawa, Nov. 26.—Contributions of farm products from Ontario are still arriving in Montreal according to information received by the Department of Trade and Commerce. When the Ontario farmers proposed gift of farm products to the mother country and the government undertook to forward the gift, it was intimated by Sir George Foster that all contributions should be in Montreal by the first of November. The result of the delay in getting much of the produce to Montreal is that it is freezing in transit. Carloads are reaching Montreal are frozen, and contributors in western Ontario, having apparently failed to realize that in eastern Ontario and on the L. Lawrence winter freeze prevails.

HAS GIVEN BOTH SIDES. Saturday Evening Post Articles Not Considered Offensive. Ottawa, Nov. 26.—No action has been taken by the post office department to prevent the Saturday Evening Post from publishing in Philadelphia, Pa. coming into Canada because of alleged pro-German articles. It has been published lately, nor is there any likelihood of their being, it is learned from the chief officials.

PROFIT-SHARING WONDERS. Employees Are Buying Homes—Adding to Savings. Detroit, Nov. 26.—At the end of the first year of the Ford profit-sharing plan with employees, every workman in the great plant is either buying a savings or purchasing home stock at the rate of \$48.76 per month. Some to the value of \$5,000,000 have been sold Ford workmen, of which amount \$1,200,000 has been paid. The gain per man in the first year is 130% per cent. Life insurance 86 per cent. In homes owned 87 1/2 per cent. Eleven hundred foreign-born employees in the Ford establishment are being taught the saving of the money, the profit-sharing plan, and the spirit of co-operation has turned the plant into a great hive of industry.

ALL SAVED BUT ONE. submarine Victim Opened the Valve To Sink Vessel. Edinburgh, Nov. 26.—It is stated that twenty-six members of the crew of the U-18 were landed at Leth, as prisoners of war. It is understood that one of the German officers, speaking of the sinking of the submarine, remarked that the only member of the crew who lost his life had opened a valve of the submarine so that the vessel might sink and not be captured. It appears that the Germans dumped into the water just before the submarine sank and that they were quickly pulled aboard the patrol ship. Gratitude was expressed by the officers for the kindness bestowed upon them by the British naval authorities. They were anxious to know if there would be an exchange of prisoners.

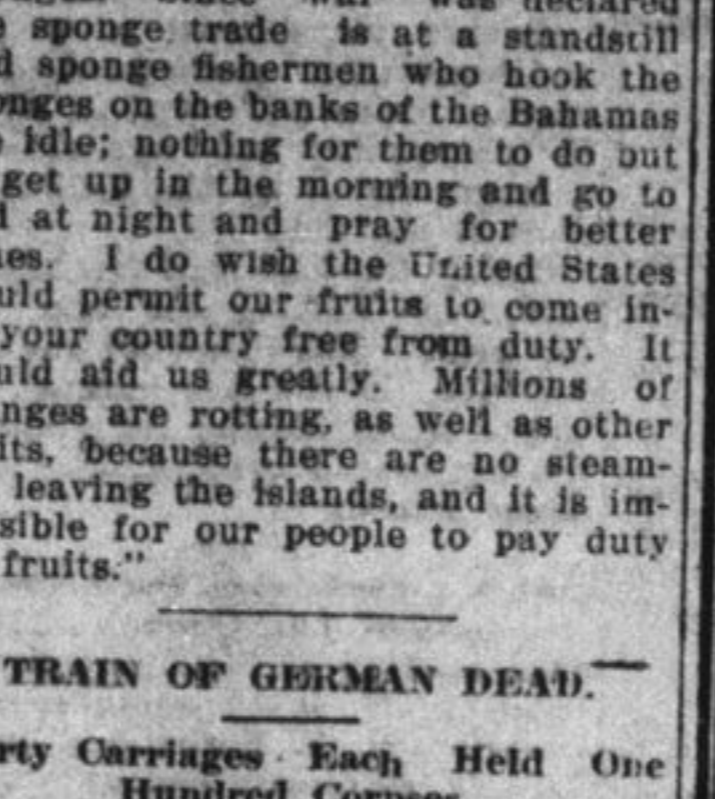
