OUR NERVES STRONGER

In Address to Forces, He Gave Assurance Of Victory.

Berlin, via London, Dec. 11.—There is published a speech made on Dec. 3rd by Emperor William at one of the army camps, composed of German and Austrians, which he visited on his recent trip to the eastern front.

"You are fighting for a just cause, for liberty, for the right to exist as a nation, and for a future of prolonged peace," said the emperor.

"We shall continue to fight with success as heretofore, for heaven is on our side. With God we shall achieve a prolonged peace, for our nerves are stronger than those of our enemy."

QUEBEC MAN SAW HORRORS.

Lieut. De Long, Wounded at Dixmude, Tells of Atrocities.

Montreal, Dec. 11.—Lieut. De Long, a resident of Verdun, Que., has returned from the battle front where he served with the Belgian army. He was wounded in the shoulder, his injury having been received just outside Dixmude. He states that he witnessed a case of German barbarism at Termonde where a seventeen-year-old girl was forcibly taken away by a German officer while her father was tied to a telegraph pole and made a target for empty champagne bottles until he was dead, and a younger brother of the girl was tightly bound and thrown to the ground.

25-HOURS IN AIR BIPLANE.

Milan Trial Showed It Could Lift 3,500 Pounds.

Milan, via Rome, Dec. 11.—A new military biplane which, it is estimated, can lift 3,300 pounds and remain in the air 25 hours, was given a successful trial here. The machine has three motors, which develop an aggregate of 300 horse power, and it is said the craft can attain a speed of 75 miles an hour. It will carry a 125-millimetre gun. On its trial to-day the machine rose to a height of 6,500 feet.

CROWDS CRIED FOR SALT.

The Jewish Refugees Number Two Million.

London, Dec. 11.—Jules Meuvissou, professor of engineering at the University of Ghent, relates that recently he went to Antwerp to buy salt, for which special permission was necessary. As he emerged a great crowd surrounded him, all crying for a handful. They were driven back by German bayonets.

"Old-Fashioned Winters."

The old inhabitant was a good deal closer to the out-of-doors than his sons and daughters ever were. In winter there was no escaping the snow and avoiding the blizzard in the shelter of superheated homes and office buildings. Houses were warmed by grates or stoves, and that called for regular trips to the woodshed as matter how wild the weather or disagreeable the task.

SAUERKRAUT UNSALABLE.

Unable to Dispose of Food, Even in England.

Ottawa, Dec. 11.—A firm in Campbellton, Ont., who, as a result of the war, have 600 barrels of sauerkraut on their hands that they have been unable to dispose of, sought the assistance of the department of trade and commerce. The department sent notices to some of the trade agents abroad. The only reply yet to hand is from the agent at Bristol, who reports "no demand for sauerkraut in that district."

CANNOT BUY ITALY.

Preferred Bribe Will Not Prevent Intervention.

Rome, Dec. 11.—The Messaggero, discussing Prince von Buelow's arrival, which is expected to be next week, alludes to the rumor that he will offer Italy the Trentino as the price of her neutrality.

The Messaggero remarks that the Trentino, even if Austria would cede it, is not enough, for it would not secure Italy's position in the Adriatic.

"To bind ourselves to Germany," it concludes, "would be to pay for her blunders in this disastrous war. Italy's armed intervention is only a question of time."

A bad impression has been created among the Italians of Trent by the hoisting of the Turkish flag beside the Austrian emblem opposite the bishop's palace. Several priests have protested.

SHORT OF AMMUNITION?

Significant German Document Found in French Village.

Paris, Dec. 11.—According to the Temps, a German document has been found in a village in the department of the Aisne, recommending that economy be observed in the use of projectiles for the artillery. The reason for the recommendation, it is said, is that the German ammunition factories, even when working at full force, are unable to supply indefinite amounts of ammunition for the army.

IMPROVED SITUATION IN THE EAST.

The Russians, finding that the Germans had weakened their front in the region of Osetochow, to get troops to the region of the river Dunajec, and turned the tables on the Germans who were gaining ground near Bobczyce.
