THE LAST MEETINGS

OF THE CIVIC COMMITTEES THIS WEEK.

Ald. Hoag to Resign His City Council Seat — To Reduce the "White Way" Lighting.

The civic committees will hold their last meetings of the year during this week, as the City Council concludes the year's business next Monday night. This is the cleaning-up week, and the time when the aldermen throw bouquets at the committee chairmen.

Ald. Hoag To Resign.

Ald. Hoag has announced that it is his intention to resign his seat as representative for Rideau ward, after twelve years' service. This will be the third resignation to be dealt with by the council at its final meeting. If any other aldermen intend to resign it is necessary that they give the council official notification by Monday next, so that provision can be made for filling their seats at the January elections.

Reduce "White Way" Lights.

It is likely that arrangements will be made whereby half the lights of the "white way" will be cut off, and thus effect a saving of several thousand dollars a year. If the taxes next year are to be kept within speaking distance, some retrenchment will have to be made.

The snow that came on Sunday night has given work to over sixty men, who are laboring for the city corporation. As the snow is light, it is expected that one day will do all the clearing necessary. However, this tangible touch of winter brings a couple of dollars into the pockets of the laboring man.


