

WHEN HE DIFFERED WITH THE DIVINE KAISER.

Wanted to Attack French Centre, Kaiser to Advance on Calais -New Chief Not Popular.

Amsterdam, Dec. 15 .- According o information received by Handelsblad the resignation General Von Moltke chief of the German general staff was not due to illness as reported from Berlin, but was in consequen ces of a conflict of opinion between the general and the kaiser. It was the wish of von Moltke to concentrate the German main against Verdun. It was his belie that a strong effort to break through the French lines there, followed by a movement in a northern direction, would have compelled the British to retreat.

To this the kaiser disagreed. His object was to break through the lines of the allies in the direction of Calais, and his favorite General von Falkenbayn, minister for war, who succeeded von Moltke as chief o the general staff, worked out plans on the lines of the kaiser's idea. 
