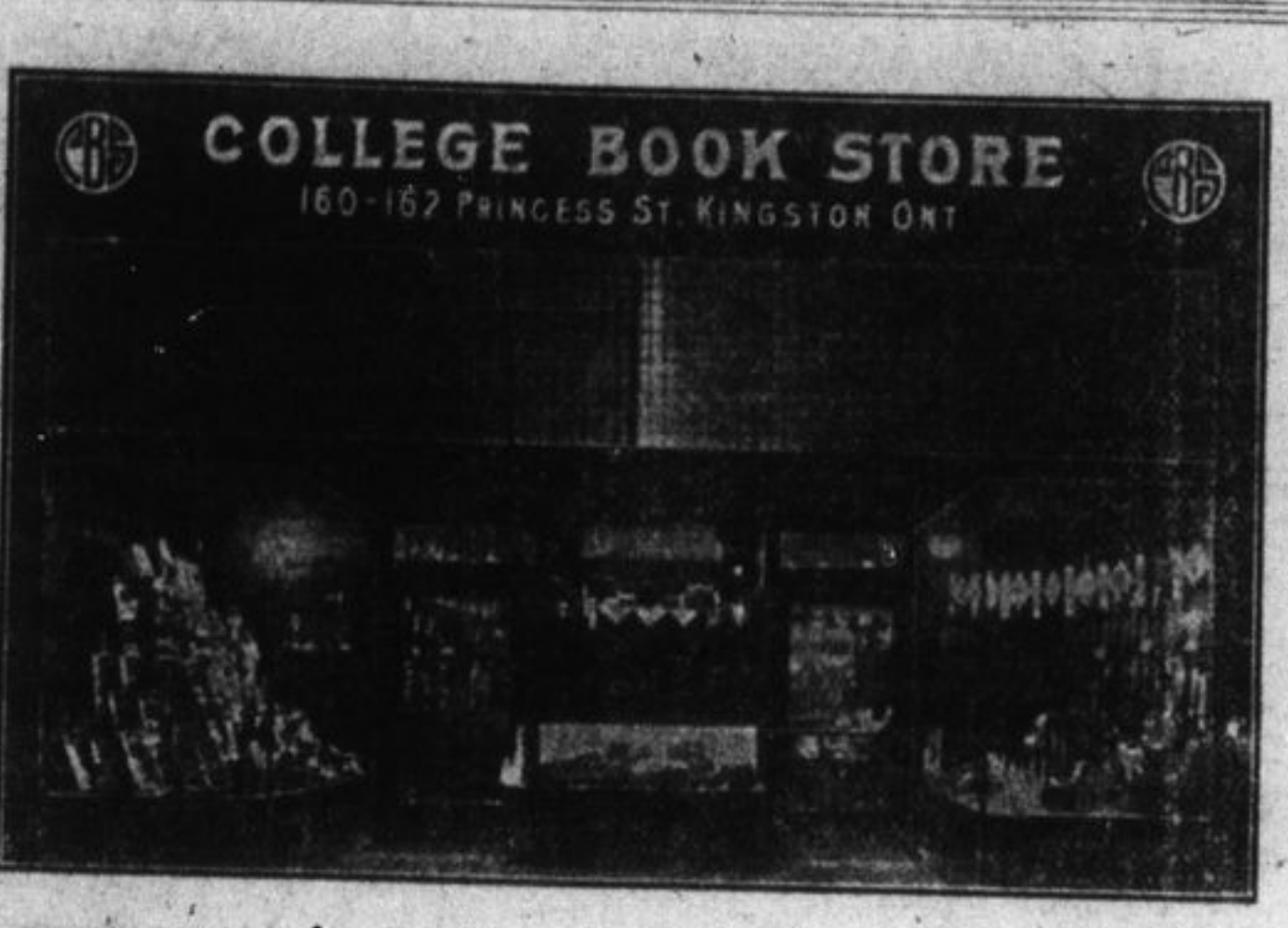

THE SPORT REVIEW

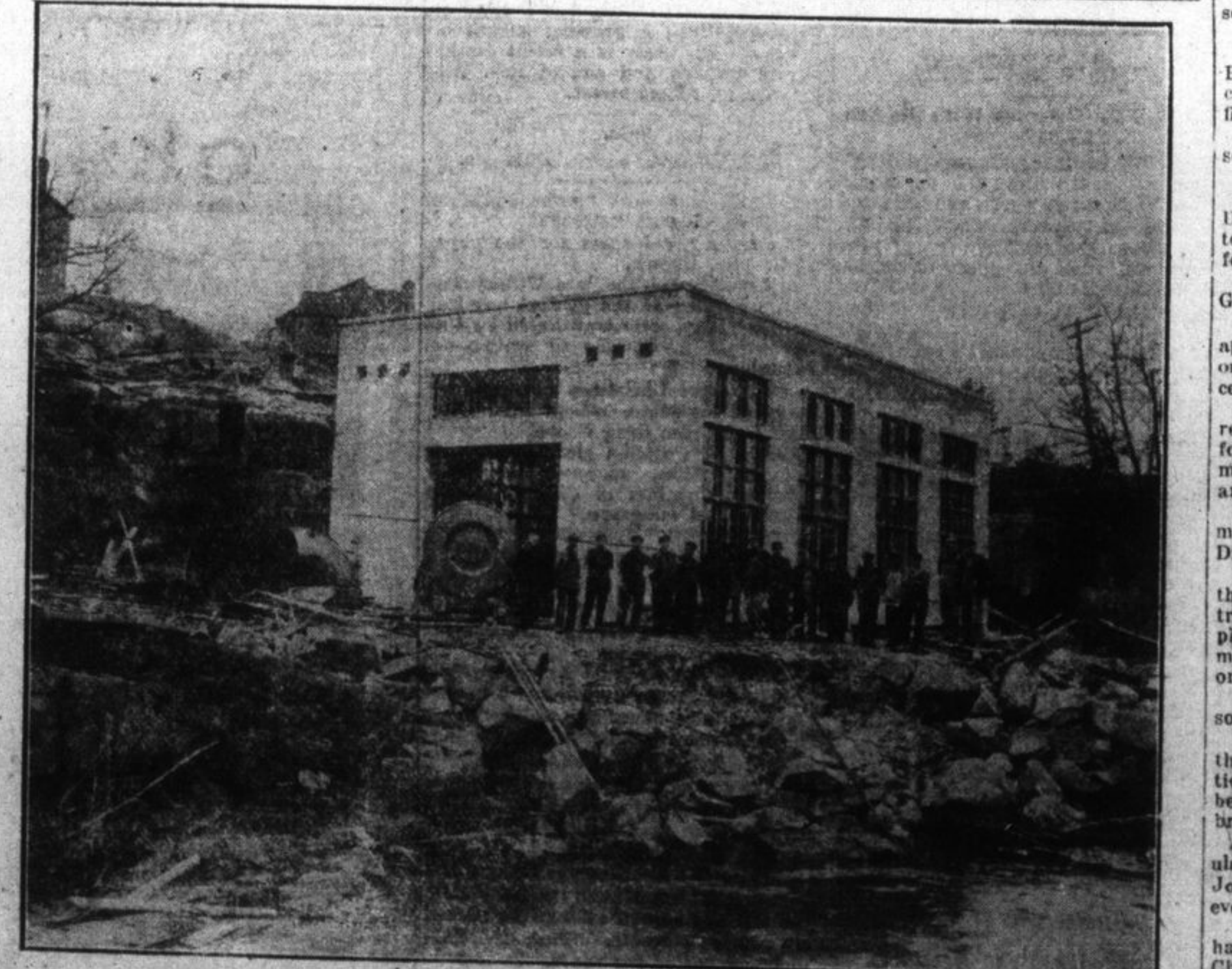
"LET WELL ENOUGH ALONE,"
IS C. R. F. U. DEFENCE.
Toronto will have hard time replacing Allan Davidson — Varsity Has Lost Two Good Goal-keepers. Winnipeg will hold its bonspiel as usual in February.
A syndicate tried to purchase the Wanderer franchise in the N.H.A. yesterday, but the owners turned down the proposition.
Ottawa Free Press: Toronto will have a hard time replacing Allan Davidson. He was a bear on offence and defence, and always had his check looking for him.
Toronto Telegram: "Hunting as usual" in England; also racing as usual. Then why all this row because the footballers continue to kick as usual.
Boston Nationals will build a stand to seat 45,000, to be ready July 4th.
Shortstop Ronch, the Buffalo captain, has jumped to the Buffalo Federals.
Varsity has been rather fortunate in the past in having good goal-keepers, but with the passing of Parker and Laird the Blue and White do not look overly strong in that department, although Malone was a fair man last season.
Hamilton Herald: All the same changes suggested in the Canadian Rugby Union's code availed nothing. Since McEwen, coach of the Montreal Winged Wheelers, and other eminent foot critics in this fair dominion have offered their opinions of what should be done, but the powers that govern absolutely refuse to budge. "Let well enough alone" is the O.R.F.U. defence.
Play in the American and National baseball leagues next season will start on April 14th. The 1915 schedules, it was said, will call for 145 games, as in former years, and the season will close on about the same date as the last season, in order to get the world's series started in good weather.
E. O. Sitter when asked for his opinion of the change in the Intercollegiate rugby rules, advocated by McGill, said that he did not approve of the rules being changed, nor did he think that they would be changed. He disapproves of the "snap-back" method of scrimmaging out the ball instead of the present method of heeling it out. He said that he had seen six of the seven intercollegiate games

this year and in all these he had only seen one play what might be called a mass play. This was due to the illegal interference offense. The interference was as bad in the O.R.F.U. games as in the intercollegiate games. The only improvement needed is the total elimination of holding. Mr. Sitter would approve of a reduced number of players although this would make no great difference.

70,000 BERLINERS KILLED
31 Per Cent. Of Organized Labor in Germany At War.
Amsterdam, via London, Dec. 19.—Berlin newspapers reaching here declare that a majority of the 70,000 residents of Berlin who went to the front have lost their lives.
Other statistical information given by these papers is that of the organized workers of Germany, who numbered \$51,000, about 31 per cent are now in active military service. The German Federation of Workers has given over \$3,750,000 for the relief of the unemployed and to assist needy women and children.
