PATR OF THE NEWS

Condensed Items by Telegram and From Exchanges.

Prince Edward County Council has voted \$500 a month for two years to the patriotic fund.

Three Toronto regiments encamped at Salisbury Plain, Eng., have been consolidated into one.

David Morrice, one of the most prominent men in the Canadian cotton industry, died at Montreal at the age of eighty-five.

The Calcutta, the third relief ship from Canada, left Halifax for Belgium Saturday with wheat, clothing, condensed milk, etc.

Provincial Inspector Greer arrested on Saturday night a half-breed Indian, William Sikas, in connection with the Whitty murder mystery.

Civil servants drawing salaries of more than \$500 a year are to be prohibited by order-in-council, to take effect after New Year's, from running for municipal office.

The death occurred suddenly on Friday of Mrs. Sarah Ann Smith, wife of Capt. J. W. Smith, Belleville. She was thirty-six years of age. A husband and six children survive.

An Italian government loan of \$200,000 at five and a half per cent. has been arranged for. The loan will be issued January, 1915, and will extend over a period of twenty-five years.

Miss Jane Burnett, an elderly and life-long resident of Leeds county, passed away Wednesday at the residence of her brother-in-law, Samuel Cooper, at Redan. Deceased was about seventy-five years of age.

Sunday was "Belgium Day" in Paris, and three million miniature Belgian flags decorated the coats of the population. All persons received the emblem after they had made contributions to the collection boxes carried through the streets by ten thousand girls. The money raised is to be used in assisting in the relief of Belgian refugees.

B. Revell, an employee of Fallon Bros., contractors, who was working on the new caseway, suffered a painful accident on Monday afternoon. While Mr. Revell was engaged drawing a cable onto a winch, his left hand became caught and drawn into the winch. The third and little fingers were badly crushed. The injured man had to be taken to the Hotel Dieu where the fingers were amputated by Dr. R. Hanley.
