FLOUR TO BRITISH GUIANA Canada's Exportation Leads to Cus-

toms' Dent. Change. Ottawa. Dec. 22.-As a result of the large quantity of Canadian flour that has been imported into British Guiana since the Canadian reciprocity treaty with the West Indies went into force, a change has been made in the customs regulations of that country. The effect of the change is that hereafter goods from Canada passing through New York must be bonded through and not re-shipped at any port. It is not unlikely that some of the other large Wast Indian colonies may take imilar action. The change has tren made in order to protect the ustoms department of British Guiana, since while part of the flour import has come from Halifax on Royal Mail steamers, part has also come by way of New York. The import of Canadian flour ino British Guiana since the reciprocity agreement has been steadily increasing, last year's import being valued at \$657.022.



CIRCULAR SKIRT, WITH YOKE.



yoke. It is trimmed with self-covered While this is one of the season's most simple skirts, it is also one of the most


fashionable. The design is carried out in diagonal serge, 2% yards being required if 54 inches wide, and 21/2 yards if 44 inches wide. The circular yoke is cut in one piece, with high waist-line. Buttons of the same material form the only trimming for the skirt. Because of the extremely simple line the skirt is both easy to cut and fit.

Using 54-inch material, a length is first folded; then the back and the yoke are placed on a lengthwise fold of the serge. The front is arranged on a lengthwise thread. If the very short effect is preferred the skirt should be cut off at the lower edges of the front and back on small "o" perforations. Now, take the front and turn under the edges of the gore and yoke at

notches; lap front gore on left, centers even, using large "O" perforations to determine the center. Stitch, leaving edges free above single large "O" perforation for opening. Join gores as notched. Sew yoke to gores, notches and centers even. Single small "o" perforations in yoke indicate center-Adjust a webbing or a straight strip

of canvas two inches wide to position underneath upper; edge of skirt for a stay; stitch upper edges together. The most fashionable finish for the plain circular skirt is a deep hem. The smart exception is, of course, the band of fur, but this is oftentimes too expensive for the everyday dress allow-
