Col. J. E. B. Seely, former secretary for war, who resigned during the home rule controversy, is to be the British liberal chief whip.  
At Washington the senate passed a bill permitting the building of a bridge across the international waters of Niagara river at Lewiston, N.Y.  
There are now only two German cruisers and two armed merchantmen to carry on commerce raiding, and they cannot long escape the allies' ships.

United States President Wilson has asked for an appropriation of \$250,000 to defray expenses of the celebration planned for opening of the Panama canal next March.  
The death sentence on Michael Popovitch, the Kamloops, B.C., murderer, has been commuted to life imprisonment.  
An effort to secure executive clemency for William Ruttan, of Bracebridge, is being made on the ground of insanity.  
Maul Singh, the Hindu who murdered Immigration Inspector Hopkins at Vancouver last summer, will pay the penalty for his crime on the 15th. The cabinet has decided not to interfere in this case, which is one of the last and most important arising out of the Komagata Maru incident at Vancouver last summer.
