WHO RULES A WARSHIP?

Captain is in Charge But Commander Does the Work

The titles captain and commander in the royal navy are very confusing to the "man on the street."

A commander is an officer promoted from a lieutenant and generally 10 to 12 years' seniority, those promotions taking place twice a year, the 30th of June and 31st of December, and are by selection.

The commander has the whole control of the discipline (of course, under the captain) of the ship, as he is the only officer, with the exception of the captain, who has the power of punishing. The engineer commander, who carries out the superintendency of his department, has no power to punish his stokers in any way, and all defaulters are brought first before the commander, who either deals with them himself or forwards them to the captain.

The commander is the busiest man on board. His day is never finished. Every signal, official correspondence, and anything dealing with the ship or fleet he has to see and initial. He is practically on a dock or superintending some drill or exercise from the time the hands fall in at 5.30 in the morning until his final inspection of the ship at 9 p.m., when he has to report to the captain that everything is correct.

The average age of a commander is about 33 when promoted. A captain in the royal navy of three years is equal in rank to a colonel in the army.
