PATRIOT WAR VETERAN ILL; WAS IN OLD FORT HENRY

Watertown, N.Y., Jan. 26.—Nelson H. Traux, one of the oldest residents of Watertown, is seriously ill at the home of his daughter in Bay City, Mich. Mr. Traux is ninety-seven years old, and the doctors hold out no hopes of his recovery.

Mr. Traux is one of the very few veterans of the Patriot war of 1857-60, and took part in the battle of the Wind Mill. He was a prisoner for many weeks in old Fort Henry, Kingston, now used to house alien enemies of England.

The Patriot war was one of the most foolish expeditions ever undertaken—200 rash young Americans making an attempt to free Canada. Cooped up in the old stone wind mill on the bank of the St. Lawrence, they defied the British soldiers, and only surrendered after the British fleet had battered the old walls so that further resistance was impossible.

England Busy Preparing For a Raid London, Jan. 26.—England is prepared for another German Zeppelin raid to-morrow. The Kaiser will celebrate his fifty-sixth birthday, Wednesday, and it is confidently predicted here that his commanders will attempt to commemorate it in a daring manner.
