The Emperor Had Expressed Hope That Bavarians Would Meet the English Just Oncee More.

Copenhagen, Feb. 4 .- A Berlin report states that the kaiser recently visited Doeberitz concentration camp. All the prisoners were mustered while the kaiser held religious service. The Raiser also sent Imperial Chancellor von Bethmann-Hollweg to the camp at Rupprecht, Bavaria. The imperial chancellor had a long! conversation with the generals and stayed two days. Von Bethmann-Hollweg then visited the headquarters of the staff of the Bavarian army and inspected the artillery positions. He reported that he brought messages from the kaiser, who hoped that the Bavarians would meet the English just once more. The kaiser was previously reported to have said to the commander of the Bavarian army corps: "I should like the English to meet the Bavari
