### TAX IMPOSITIONS.

N. C. Polson & Co. Manufacturing Druggists, Will Feel the Tax Levied on Proprietary Medicines.

The war tax increases announced by the Canadian minister of finance will affect the wholesale manufacuring firm of N. C. Polson & Co., Kingston, very materially. This firm's business extends all over the world. The announcement of a tax on proprietary medicines means that the firm's business will be at a ctandstill until the full details areannounced, for further sales cannot be made under present conditions

The war tax on tolegraph measages will likely be collected by the sate of special stamps. These stamps will be sold at every telegraph office and the agent will be responsible. that every message received will have one of the stamps affixed to it. This system is now in use in the United States, a cent being charged against either of the two parties incrested in the message.

There was a suspicious look about him, and some of the men in his company thought tunt de acted strangely. his lack of knowledge of British and Canadinn anairs was marked, and some peneved he had a German accent. his undoing was that he talked in his sleep, according to information received from members of the pattation. He was neard by some of his bunk mates to be running down the British cause, and it is said that quite a few words in German slipped into his nocturnal con-

versation with mimself. The next day, without saying anything to anyone, those who had heard the man talking in his sleep tried to draw him out, and when they ran down Germany he seemed to resent it, in spite of an effort to hide his real feelings.

Finally one of the men is said to have called him "a --- German." The result of the suspicions was that the man was detained and had his uniform taken away.
