### A BIG TIME ASSURED

CARNIVAL COMMITTEES ARE MAKING GOOD PROGRESS.

In Arrangements for "Send-Off" to Be Given Men Going Overseas—Half Holiday Proposed for Wednesday, Feb. 24th.

Everything is progressing nicely with the committees having in charge the military carnival, and the workers are looking for a big crowd and a grand time.

There was a meeting of the finance committee in connection with the carnival, on Thursday night, when the members canvassing the city for funds had a most encouraging report to present.

The entire programme has not yet been decided upon, but the aim is to have something to suit the various tastes, and the committees are sparing no pains to make everything a success.

The opening event takes place on Monday evening, Feb. 22nd, when the presentation of colors to the 21st Battalion and the 22nd Battery will take place at the armories. Tuesday and Wednesday will be given over to various attractions.

Arrangements are being made for hockey games, in which Kingston, Belleville and Brockville teams will take part.

The sports programme will include many novelties. A snowshoe race is among one of the sports suggested, while the military sports will afford much amusement. The curling rink will likely be secured for games among the military men. It is stated that there are some crack curlers in the military ranks.

One special feature, which has been definitely decided upon, is that of a merchants' drive. The Shedden company has very kindly offered their horses and rigs to the merchants for this parade. There is a likelihood of Mayor Sutherland proclaiming a half holiday on Wednesday, Feb. 24th, in order to give all the citizens an opportunity of taking part in the doings. The mayor stated on Friday morning that quite a number of citizens had suggested the half holiday, and that if it were desired, he would issue the necessary proclamation.

Very neat invitations have been issued by the committee for members going overseas to send to their friends, asking them to come to Kingston, and attend the ceremonies; and it is expected that the city will be filled to overflowing with visitors.

Queen's Choral Society has kindly offered to repeat the recent entertainment for the carnival week. A fancy dress carnival at the covered rink is under consideration.
