On Friday afternoon Bridget McCue, widow of the late Daniel Corrigan, died at her late residence, 58 Lower Bagot street, after a brief illness. The deceased was born at Duncannon, County Tyrone, Ireland, seventy-five years ago, and came direct to Kingston when a girl of five years of age. Here she since resided, and practically lived in the same block on Bagot street, between North and West streets, her entire life. In religion the late Mrs. Corrigan was a Roman Catholic. She was a devout member of St. Mary's cathedral, as well as a member of the League of the Sacred Heart. The deceased is mourned by eleven children, all of whom were at the bedside when she died. On Monday morning at 10.30 o'clock the funeral was held from her late residence, 58 Bagot street, to St. Mary's cathedral, where a requiem mass was sung by Rev. Father J. Hanley. In the sanctuary where Rev. Father Murphy, an old friend of the family, who came to this country at the same time as the late Mrs. Corrigan. Rev. Father Halligan was also present. Throughout the service solos were sung by Rev. Father McDonald, Portmouthe, Nicholas O'Connor and Charles Cross. The pall-bearers were the four sons and two grandsons of the deceased: Michael Corrigan, Gananoque; Frank, Patrick and Charles Corrigan, at this city; John and Michael Kennedy, of Portmouthe. The remains were placed in St. Mary's vault.

Cobalt, Feb. 15.—Operations at the Trethewey mine and mill will be suspended indefinitely, according to a general notice given to the miners and office staff. The mill will close some time this month, on account of the power situation. A protest against the election of Nelson B. Porter, as mayor, and J. A. Ellis and J. W.
