## SAWMILL WAS BURNED

ANGLIN & CO. SUFFERED A LOSS TUESDAY, AFTERNOON.

Blaze Likely Originated From Spontaneous Combustion-The Damage BY MAY 1ST, THREE UNFURNISHED Will Amount to \$15,000.

At 12.45 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, Angla & Cos factory, destroying the large building containing the planing and sawing departments, as well as mica assortment room.
