WORLD'S END IS NEAR

Great War Fulfills Scriptural Prophecy in Prelates Opinion.

Baltimore, Md., Feb. 18.—That scriptural prophecy of the conditions that shall prevail near the end of the world seems to be in process of fulfillment was the statement made by Cardinal James Gibbons.

He was commenting on the war news from Europe, which he said was terrible. "We cannot grasp its magnitude or what it means," he added. "Does it not seem that the scriptures are being fulfilled—'nation shall rise against nation and there shall be sorrow throughout the world, and then shall come the end?' he was asked.

"Yes, it does," the cardinal replied. "Loss of life in great numbers occurs only once in a while. But now, in this greatest war of the world, a thousand, nay, ten thousand, lives are being sacrificed every hour the war continues."
