London, Feb. 20.—The Daily News prints the following: "The king of Bavaria recently spent three days at the Krupps, and at a banquet given in his honor, delivered a speech which is reported in the Koinische Zeitung.

"I have just come from the seat of war, he said, and can assure you that in spite of the long struggle, the spirit of our troops is quite firstclass. It is the same among those who are at the front as among those who are at home; the people throughout the German empire are resolved not to conclude peace until their enemies have been thrown to the ground and sue us for peace, whereupon we shall be able to dictate such a peace as will again secure for us tranquility for many decades to come.'-
