



British Soldier In London Hospital Has Strange Experience. London, March 1 .- Amongst the

many curious cases of wounds which have been investigated by X-rays at Saint Bartholomew's Hospital is one in which a German bullet was found embedded in the muscular part of a soldier's heart. The radiographer who located it told The Chronicle representative that the bullet entered the man's left shoulder and burrowed downwards, and the amazing part of the affair was that after the soldier had been hit he walked for one and one-haff miles to the ambulance. He did not realize that he was wound ed, he said, until he saw a few splashes of blood. The bullet was not removed, and the man lived after-

This, is by no means an isolated case of a man living, and even following some occupation with a foreign body in his vital part. Two interesting radio-photos in the laboratory at St. Bartholomew's illustrated this. One was that of a German bullet embedded in the right lung. It measured about one and one-quarter inches long, and the delineation was perfect. Others show a number of pieces of shrapnel in the skull cavity at the base of the eye, underneath the brain. The shrapnel entered one side of the cheek and pene-
