GERMANS CONCENTRATING For Still Another Drive at Channel Ports. Paris, March 4.—It is believed here that the Germans are concentrating forces in Flanders for a new drive at the Channel ports, notably Calais. This belief is based on a despatch from London saying that the German commanders have received orders to stop all traffic on roads leading from the interior of Belgium to West Flanders in order to prevent the leaking out of news regarding the movement of troops.

DAILY BREAD RATION. Of the Germans Fined at Less Than Half a Pound. Berlin, via London, March 4.—The North German Gazette has announced that the daily bread ration throughout the empire has been fixed at 280 grammes, a little less than half a pound of bread or flour per capita from March 15th, instead of 225 grammes, the amount previously permitted.
