GERMANS NOV

TO ESTABLISH DEFENSIVE LINE IN RUSSIAN TERRITORY.

The Russians Declare The Enemy's Attacks Have Lost Force- Right Flank Of the Foe Is In Danger

Petrograd, March 8 .- Reoccupaion by the Russians of Stanislau is regarded here as justifying their claim that the rapid advance of the Austro-German right flank in East Galicia was hazardous so long as their left flank in Galicia was sucessfully held back by the Russian forces. The right Austro-German flank advanced impetuously apparently without regards to the inability of the left wing to co-operate in the contemplated encircling movements. The right flank in consequence is now in danger of having the tables turned and being surrounded by Russian forces.

The Russians now look for the reirement, of the Austrians from Czernowitz and all of Bukowina where the Austrian position will be come untenable if the Russians are able to continue the successful move ment initiated at Stanislau.

Russian staff officers say since the failure of the Austro-Germans in the Stanislau region their attacks have weakened not only in that vicinity but in West Galicia, between the rivers Ondava and San. Their Despatches From Near And Distant attacks, here, in the opinion of the Russian staff, are a device to draw the Russian troops westward from Hallicz and the river Dniester.

The Russians apparently have been able, however, to interfere seriously with the plan by the advance of the tenth army, which the Germans asserted was virtually destroyed as a result of the German victory in East Prussia. The successes of the tenth army in the Lomza district treaten to compel the withdrawal of the Germans from Grodno or import maintenance of their communications between these two portions of the German forces in the north.
