CANADIANS DOING WELL. Excel at Front in Rapid and Accurate Shooting.

Ottawa, March 8.—That Canada has good reasons to be proud of the Canadian troops who have already reached the firing line, is the opinion of despatches which have reached Ottawa from various sources in England and France. In addition to these despatches, it is understood that the Government is being kept informed from day to day in official communications as to the progress of the operations in France and Belgium, including the work of the Canadian troops. These communications are said to apply particularly to the conduct of the Canadian troops in action. The Canadians are showing themselves to be expert in rapid and accurate rifle shooting, and in this respect are said to be the equal of any troops in the field.

FOUGHT WITH THEIR ALLIES. 300 Turks Were Killed in Retreat From Suez.

London, March 8.—Telegraphing from Cairo, the Daily Mail's correspondent says: "During the retreat of the Turks after the recent Suez operations the German officers had an open conflict with their allies and three hundred of the latter were killed in a single affair near Jerusalem."
