OPPOSITION'S ACTION
Demand Economy in Expenditures—Protest Against Tax.
Ottawa, March 9.—The budget debate was resumed to-day and will probably not be finished this week. Mr. Bradburn, of Selkirk, in resuming the debate this afternoon, criticized the inopportune timing of the Liberal upon the tariff question. Both political parties in Canada, he said, really favored a protective tariff, but while the Conservatives were honest about it the Liberals were hypocritical. He said that Mr. Nesbitt, the Liberal member for North Oxford, had assented to the tariff reduction in the reciprocity campaign of 1911 that there would be no reduction in the duty upon agricultural implements. This was indignantly denied by Mr. Nesbitt, who twice invited the Selkirk member to step outside the chamber and fight it out.
Mr. Fisher (Brant) urged that the soldiers at the front be allowed to vote. His county had sent nearly a thousand men to the front and it would be an outrage to deny franchise them. There might be some practical difficulties in the way, but they certainly could be overcome, because in the American civil war no less than one hundred and twenty thousand soldiers had voted at the presidential election of 1864.
To Move Budget Amendment.
When the budget debate was resumed this afternoon in the Commons the first speaker was Sir Wilfrid Laurier. It is expected that the opposition leader will close the remarks on the new war taxation proposals by moving an amendment. The party whips have notified their followers that there is likely to be a diversion, and absentees have been mentioned. The nature of amendment, it is understood, will voice an objection on the part of the Liberals to the increase in duties on British imports. Sir Robert Borden will doubtless reply to the opposition leader, while Hon. W. T. White, Hon. George H. Graham and other leaders on both sides will be drawn into the discussion.
