

Reference was made to the great hindrance the use of liquor was to human development, and statistics were given to show how crime could be traced to the use of strong drink. All these figures could not be regarded as accidents, but on the other hand, they were absolutely the cause \$ 2,980.00 and effect. Men when not drinking were kind and gentle; when drinking liquor they were brutes and would commit crime which they would not think of committing when in their sober senses. Even the man who indulged a little in strong drink would be a much better man if he left it alone. It was the duty. of every man to be at his best, and while drinking liquor he could not be at his best.

"God's side is never the whiskey speaker with great emphasis. He went on to show how strong drink was an injury on mankind; how it effected the child life and deprived many of an education.

Mr. Spence spoke of the great progress made against the liquor forces in the last ten years. He said there had been a great awakening, and the good work was continuing. There was a great world movement In Russia, at the present time, strong drink had been barred. All over the world it was the one great

Mr. Spence preached in Cooke's Church on Sunday evening.



"No undertaker, clergyman, sexton, house holder or other person shall engage in the removal, embalming, or urial of the dead body of any person before this certificate of registration of death has been issued by a division registrar for sub-registrar The fine for violation of this statutory provision may be \$20 and
