HIGHLANDERS! FIX BAYONETS!



Mark the words along the line: An Empire built like a house of sand. But the plowman rears like an angry thing. And the crying war notes come to him. Highlanders—Fix Bayonets!

So much has already been heard, and so much more is certain to be heard on both sides of the Atlantic of the new war song, "Highlanders, Fix Bayonets," that the question is being asked as to who are the men who have given this to the nation. Examination discloses just what might have been expected—that the song itself, with long generations of service to the empire behind them.

The writer of the words, William J. Pitts, is a member of the 48th Highlanders in Toronto, Canada. Geoffrey O'Hara, the composer, is a family whose outstanding profession for many years was war. He is descended on his father's side from Mr. O'Hara, Lord Tyravely of Kilmahine, Ireland; on his mother's side from John Dobbs, an officer in Queen's Elizabeth army, who married a granddaughter of Hugh O'Neill, the "fighting Earl of Tyrone." Their son, Arthur Dobbs, was Governor of North Carolina in 1753. Mr. O'Hara's grandfather was Lieut.-Col. in the British Army through the Peninsula War. He had eight medals for gallant service and was knighted by the government of Portugal and was made Asst. Adj. General of the British forces in Canada in 1827.

FINANCIAL MATTERS
The Mineral Wealth of Nova Scotia For 1914. Halifax, March 19.—The mineral wealth of Nova Scotia is clearly shown by the report of the Department of Public Works and Mines of the Nova Scotia Government, which has just been issued. During the past year Nova Scotia produced 7,000,000 lbs of coal, 335,515 tons of limestone, 283,340 tons of gypsum, 1,400 tons of barytes, and 13,156 tons of gold-bearing ore.

Trade Practically Paralyzed. Washington, D.C., March 19.—Secretary Redfield has made public a cablegram from Governor-General Harrison, in which he states that the Philippine trade to the United States is practically paralyzed for lack of ships on which to export hemp, sugar, copra and other Philippine products.

Increased Drug Capitalization. Ottawa, March 19.—The capital stock of Riker-Hegeman Drug Stores, Limited, has been increased from \$10,000 to \$15,000, and the name is changed to "Tamblyn Drug Stores, Limited."

Domjion Steel Corporation. Montreal, March 19.—The output of pig iron by the Dominion Steel Corporation in February was larger than in the similar month a year ago and showed a perceptible increase over January of this year.

An Underwood Surplus. The Underwood Typewriter Company, New York, has called our attention to an item which we published on March 4th, stating that they reported a deficit of \$149,904 for last year. This item, which was copied from an erroneous report circulated through one of the news agencies of New York city, is, instead of a deficit for 1914, the company, after paying their regular dividends for the year, and putting aside a very considerable sum for depreciation, were able to carry \$17,396.61 to their surplus account.

Dividend Hardly Likely. Toronto, March 19.—The recent advance in Maple Leaf Milling, from 28 to 42, a gain of 14 points, has started a rumor that the stock is to go on a 4 per cent. dividend basis, but this is doubted. The buying is said to be largely by investors who understand the position of the company. For the year ended March 31st, earnings are expected to be about double the previous year. In 1913 the earnings represented 31 on the common.

Financial News. Russia has ordered 46,000 tons of steel valued at \$2,000,000 from the Cambria Steel Co., to be used in the manufacture of warships. The United Shoe Machinery Company of Canada, Mississauga, has been incorporated with capital of \$1,000,000.

American Woolen Co., for year ended Dec. 31st, shows profits increased \$3,406,287. This is equal to 6.97 per cent on the preferred stock. The surplus in postal revenue in the United States for the 1914 fiscal year amounted to \$3,500,000. This is the second surplus since 1836.

The world's production of gold last year is officially estimated at 291,254,000, as compared with 293,452,000 in 1913 and 296,077,000 in 1912. This was the smallest output since 1908.
