Accused Father Hung Himself In Wellington

(Special to the Whig.) Pictou, March 22 - David Vandewater, Wellington, committed suicide by hanging himself this morning. Vandewater was accused, along with his son, of criminal assault on a young girl, and his trial was postponed till the fall assizes. The son was sentenced to two years at Guelph about a week ago, and the father was released on ten thousand dollars bail, to appear next fall.

SALVATION ARMY WORK. Big Meeting in the Citadel on Sunday Afternoon.

The Salvation Army Citadel was the scene of a very large gathering on Sunday afternoon. Colonel Gaskin, chief dominion secretary, and prominent Kingston citizens took part. W. F. Nickle, M.P., acted as chairman of the afternoon, after Rev. Alfred Brown opened with prayer. In speaking of the Salvation Army work Mr. Nickle said that if there was less crime and more Christianity in the world we would have a better world. The number of paroles granted from the dominion penitentiaries and prisons was dealt with by the chairman. Thanks to the good services of the Salvation Army, out of 6,000 liberated only three per cent broke their parole.

Col. Gaskin said that if it were not for the Salvation Army there would be no social work accomplished. Col. Gaskin gave a splendid address with regard to the good work being accomplished by the Army. He declared that the sooner the country prohibited the liquor traffic the better it would be for the people. In closing he hoped the time would come when all churches would adopt the penitent form, where all true Christians would come and kneel at the altar, opening up their hearts thanks to God.

The Late Dr. W. J. Pasmore. Toronto, March 22 - The funeral took place on Saturday from the train to the cemetery at Rockwood, Ont., of the late W. J. Pasmore, M.D., formerly of Toronto, and recently of Deseronto. In the early days of his practice in Waterloo County the late Dr. Pasmore was prominent in political circles, acting for many years as township organizer for the late I. E. Rowan, M.P. (Liberal), father of Charles M. Rowan, M.P. for North Bruce. He was also among the first active temperance workers in Ontario at a time when temperance legislation and those who advocated it were not as popular as now, and when petty persecutions of the "cranks" society, were not uncommon.

First to Volunteer From This Place Has Given His Life. Belleville, March 22 - Private Ross Herman, who was killed in action on March 2nd, was formerly a sergeant with No. 2 Company, 49th Regiment, he having first attended the annual training camp five years ago as a bugler. He was about twenty-one years of age, and was the first of No. 2 Company, Frankford, to volunteer for overseas service when war broke out. He possessed great talent as an entertainer. He leaves two brothers older than himself, William of Trenton and Charles at home. Canadian Dies Like Hero. Paris, March 22 - Jules Camague, of the 23rd Infantry, a Canadian volunteer, is mentioned in the order of the day. He made a rush upon a German trench and tried to break in the protecting roof. His bayonet and rifle were broken, but he refused to surrender and was killed on the spot.
