Russia's Staying Powers Enormous, Says Prof. Vogt. Amsterdam, March 31.—Prof. Vogt, a well-known German authority on Russian affairs, warns Germany in the forecasts that "it will take a long time, great energy and patience and many victories to gain headway against the new Russian army."
