IN MILITARY CIRCLES

BARRIEFIELD CAMP TO OPEN ON 21ST OF APRIL.

The Queen's Stationary Hospital Corps may not get away before the end of the month.

It is understood that the big camp on Barriefield Heights will open on the 1st of April, and that the Queen's Engineers and the Queen's Ordnance Training Corps will be the first to encamp.
