MEDICAL INSPECTION

OF IMMIGRANTS IS VERY MUCH NEEDED. Some Filthy Ones Have Been Returned to the Agent Here By Farmers Who Could Not Stand Them. Immigration Agent George Hunter has had to take back several immigrants in the last few weeks because the farmers who had accepted them would not keep them because of their physical condition. Medical inspection of all immigrants should be made before they are allowed to go into the country where farmers pride themselves on their cleanliness. The farmers in this part of the country use their hired help as part of the family and they are given as good accommodation as the farmer can provide. Some of the immigrants should be in hospital, or at least be made to take a bath. The men that are sent out appear to be all right when they go or the farmer would not accept them, but after a short time on the farm their condition is found out. condition is found out and it is the farmer's wife who has to bear the brunt of the mistake. All this could be remedied if the Government would pay for the inspection of all immigrants by a competent medical man. It would not be expensive and would save a great deal of inconvenience later. As a rule the immigrants who arrive in this district are of the better class and take care of themselves, but there is the other kind and as a result they cause a lot of trouble.

INJURED IN RUNAWAY.

Timothy Lawson, Sydenham, in a Critical Condition. The life of Timothy Lawson, who in company with his daughter, was driving at Sydenham on Monday afternoon, was saved by another man who saw the animal dashing along the roadway dragging Mr. Lawson who was holding on desperately to the reins. The horse became frightened and the occupants were thrown out to close. Mr. Lawson was also badly shaken up and lies at his home in a very precarious condition. The injured man is sixty-seven years of age.

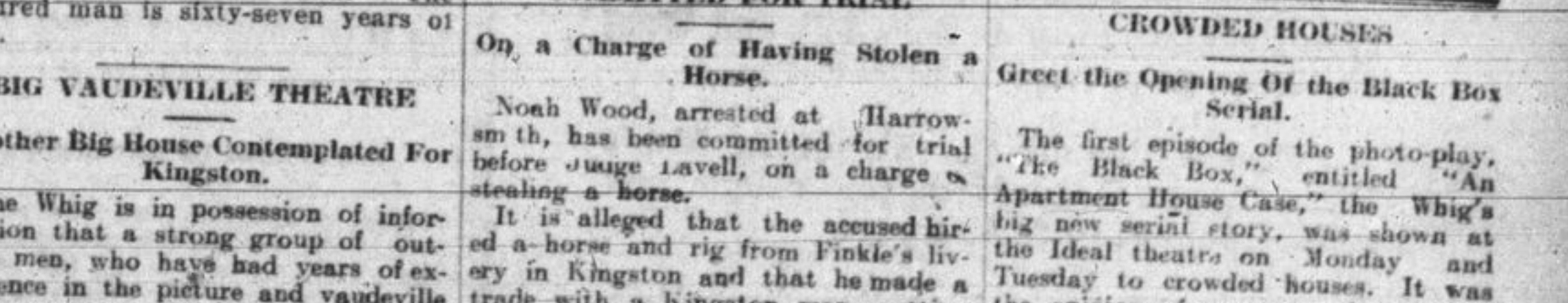
