CANADIANS A STRENGTH TO THE BRITISH FORCES

General Sir John French Pays a High Tribute to Our Troops.

London, April 15. - General French's report, issued yesterday, pays a high tribute to the Canadian troops.

"All the Canadians serving in the army," he says, "have splendidly upheld the traditions of the Empire and have proved a great source of additional strength to the forces."

On February 15th the Canadian division began its march. I inspected the division which was under the command of Lieutenant-General E. A. H. Alderson.

"Since then the division has thoroughly justified the good opinion which I formed of it. The troops of the Canadian division were first attached for a few days by brigades for training the third corps trenches, under Lieutenant-General Sir William Pulteney, who gave me such an excellent report of their efficiency that I was able to employ them in the trenches early in March.

"During the battle of Neuve Chapelle they held part of the line allotted to the first army. Although they were not actually engaged in the main attack, they rendered valuable help by keeping the enemy actively employed in front of their trenches."

A war of extermination has been commenced against blackbirds by the Berlin Game Protective Association. Mutah Singh was killed and two other Hindus wounded in an explosion which wrecked a house in Vancouver.

The Railway Commission hears objections to rate increases from crushed stone dealers, grain men, and others.

At Norwalk, O., John Gardner, aged ninety-nine years, said to have been the oldest active banker in the United States, died on Wednesday.

Lieut.-Col. Wile, Windsor, commander of the Eighteenth Battalion, will be given a staff appointment in either England or France.

W. F. Maclean, M.P., Toronto announces the engagement of his daughter Mary Lewis to Harry Sifton, third son of Sir Clifford Sifton and Lady Sifton, Ottawa.

The postal authorities at Dover, Eng., have issued a notice inviting applications from girls of fifteen or sixteen, willing to replace boys as telegraph messengers.

The parcel mails between Canada and France by Allan Line steamers will be resumed on the 15th inst.

Arrangements have been completed for the shipment to America of two cargoes of German dyestuffs which were paid for by the American importers before March 1st and are now at Rotterdam.

GERMANS ARE DIVIDED ON SUBMARINE WARFARE. Chancellor Thinks Von Tirpitz Will Injure Relations With the Neutrals.

Retterdam, April 15. - From one who is in close touch with diplomatic circles in Berlin I learn there is a serious difference of opinion regarding the submarine warfare against mercantile shipping.

At one time there was a definite split in the Government. The scheme originated by Admiral Von Tirpitz met with strong opposition from Chancellor Bethmann-Hollweg, who held the view that the advantages gained would be quite incommensurate with the detrimental effect upon neutral countries.
