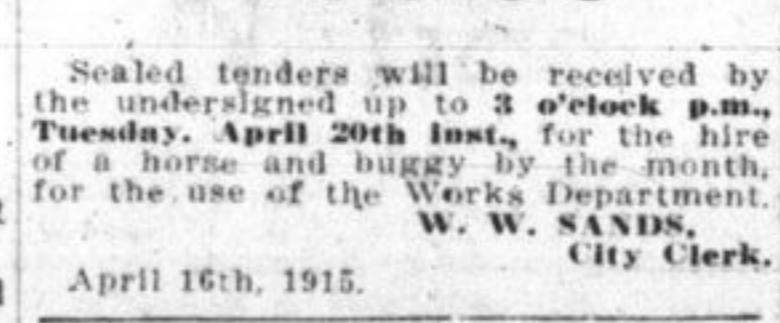

INDIRECT PEACE TALK. Austria-Hungary Took a "Feeler" At Russia. London, April 16.-A Petrograd despatch to the Daily Mail says: "While denying categorically that Austria has made any direct peace advances to Russia, officials here admit that peace suggestions have come from the Pope at the instigation of private persons in Austria-Hungary. "The Pope's communication merely asked whether, if Austria were willing, Russia would enter into negotiations with a view to peace. The answer was that if Austria desired peace she must ask the Allies for their conditions, which would then be considered and communicated to the Austrian Government."

A New York Murder That Baffles The Police. New York, April 16.-New York's latest murder mystery assumed new proportions yesterday after the police had established, to their apparent satisfaction, identity of the victim as Miss Claudia Hanbury, Lansingburg, arrested Raffaele Vigorelli, a well-to-do contractor, and charged him with homicide. The next element was the declaration of persons in Troy that they had found Miss Hanbury living there and had talked with her. The spot where the slain girl's body was found in a vacant lot of the Astor estate, in the Bronx, was her trysting place, whoever she was, according to John F. McKenna, watchman of the estate. McKenna said a man near the spot on several occasions. The girl he identified as the one whose body lies in the morgue, the man as Vinlio.
