



Kitchener Renounces Heresy London, April 17 .- "There was at one time an idea that the War Office frowned to some extent on bantam battalions," said Lord Roseberry at a luncheon in Edinburgh yesterday in connection with the first parade of

the 17th Royal Scots, who are known as "The Roseberry bantams." "But on mentioning this to Lord Kitchener," Lord Roseberry added, " received a letter in reply, which began, 'If anybody says I'm opposed to the bantam, he's a liar.' I can conceive of nothing more concise or expressive as a renunciation of the heresy."

Hungary Papers Attack Germany. Basle, April 17.-All newspapers in Budapest and Hungary of pronounced Roumanian sympathy, or known to favor Pan-Slavist doctrines, have been required by the Government to suspend publication.

All of the Hungarian papers are printing direct or indirect attacks upon the Governments of Austria and Germany, which are tacitly charged with defending their own frontiers while Hungary is likely to bear the brunt of the Russian invasion.


Engineer For Hamilton
