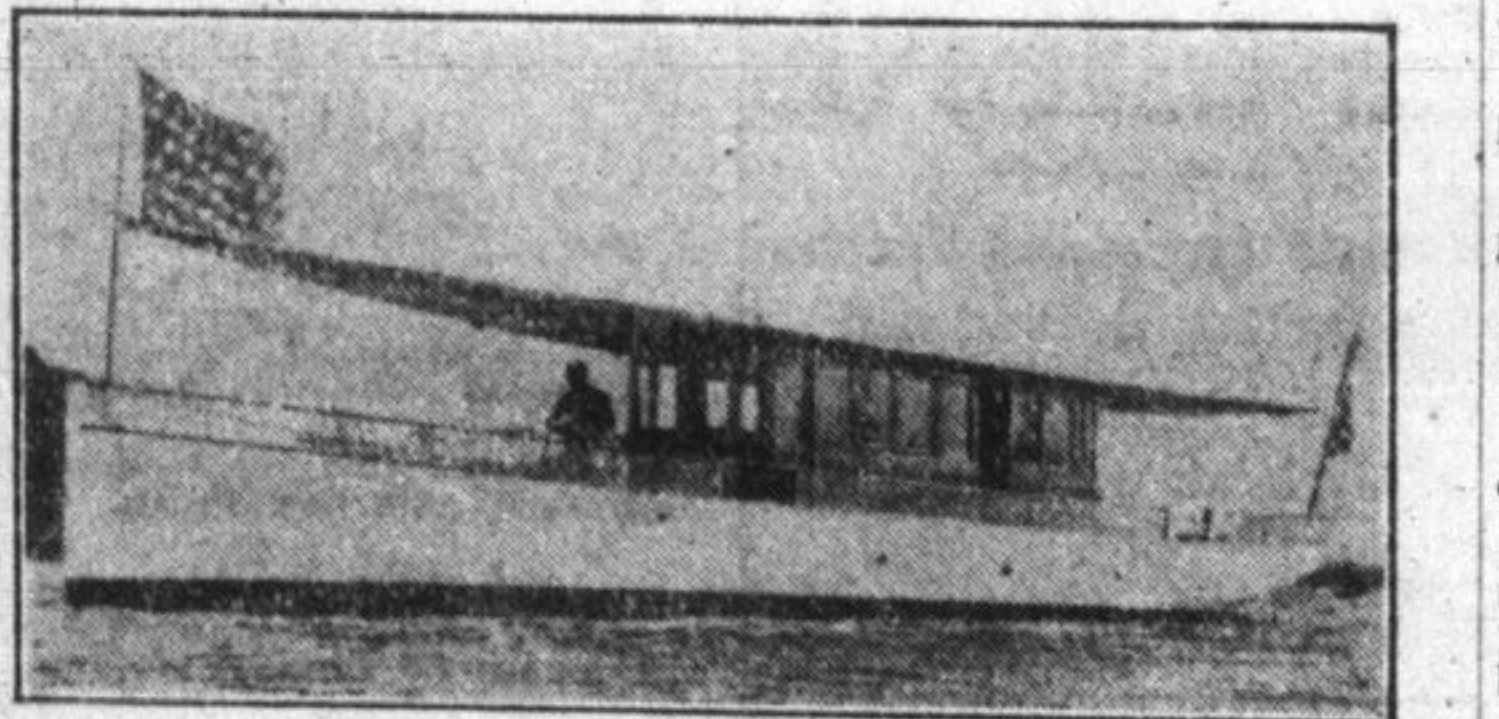

Prof. D. H. Marshall Gives Some Good Advice With Regard to the Question of Daylight Saving.

Writing to the Whig on the question of "Daylight Saving," Prof. D. H. Marshall says: "Alderman Newman should certainly be encouraged in his endeavor to make the Kingston community take advantage of the longer daylight during the four warm months of our summer, May, June, July and August."

How the different parts of the day should be used is essentially a local question. What Alderman Newman really wishes is a moral reform in using the daylight to greater advantage. The easy and proper way to do this is to begin and end our regular daily work one hour earlier during the four months specified.

GERMAN ARMY DISCIPLINE

Is Principally Due To Fear Of Brutal Officers.

London, April 17.—Discussing conditions in the German army, a statement by the British Eye Witness says:

"The general state of mind prevailing in the enemy's ranks is hard to realize. The discipline is principally that of fear, the men being in positive terror of their officers who behave with a kind of studied truculence, befitting slave drivers. This is borne out by the use of cat o' nine tails, one of these implements being captured by us near Neu-Chappelle.

WAR CONTRACT COMMISSION

Will Soon Be Named by the Government.

Ottawa, April 17.—The Government will lose no time in selecting a commissioner to supervise all war contract expenditures on the lines of Sir Robert Borden's declaration. If one man can be secured to undertake the exceedingly responsible work, that course is favored. If not, there will be a commission of three.

London, April 17.—"There was at one time an idea that the War Office frowned to some extent on bantam battalions," said Lord Roseberry at a luncheon in Edinburgh yesterday in connection with the first parade of the 17th Royal Scots, who are known as "The Roseberry bantams."

Hungary Papers Attack Germany.

Budapest, April 17.—All newspapers in Hungary and Germany of pronounced Roumanian sympathy, or known to favor Pan-Slavist doctrines, have been required by the Government to suspend publication.

Engineer For Hamilton.

Hamilton, April 17.—E. R. Gray, Toronto, was yesterday appointed assistant city engineer. City Engineer Macallum favored re-employment of Wilfrid Hollingsworth, former assistant city engineer, but the Board of Control refused. Macallum then recommended Gray. Hollingsworth was with the municipal staff in Toronto before coming here.
