CONVICT TOOK HIS LIFE SHE WANTED TO WORK

BY HANGING IN HIS CELL AT PENITENTIARY.
Edward King Sentenced For Murder At Brandon Was of Unsound Mind—Inquest Was Held on Tuesday Night.
While temporarily insane, Edward King, a convict in the Portsmouth penitentiary, hanged himself in his cell on Tuesday afternoon.
At the request of Warden Creighton an inquest was held on Tuesday night, and Dr. R. J. Gardiner presiding, when the verdict was to the effect that King took his life while of an unsound mind.
King was sentenced for murder at Brandon in 1907 and was transferred to the penitentiary at Portsmouth in 1908. He was sentenced to be hanged, but his sentence was afterwards commuted to life imprisonment.

CHLORINE GAS LATEST WEAPON OF DEATH TO BE USED BY GERMANY.

Favorable Wind Awaited to Carry Fumes Across to Lines of Enemy.
London, April 28.—A correspondent in a message dated April 26th, describing the use of chlorine gas by the Germans, says:
"On the evening of the 22nd French soldiers saw rising from the first line trenches a short distance away a number of white fumes, evidently intended as signals. Almost at once all along the German trenches a thick curtain of yellow smoke arose, and was blown gently toward the French trenches by the north-east wind. This curtain, which advanced like a yellow wind of North China, offered this peculiarity that it spread thickly on the ground, rising to a height of sixteen feet only. I call your attention here to the fact that these were not asphyxiating bombs that the Germans used. They were big reinforced bottles of gas, compressed at a high pressure, which the Germans placed on top of their trenches, and of which they opened the taps when it seemed to them that the wind coming from behind them would carry the poison to the enemy's trenches. The French soldiers were naturally taken by surprise. Some got away in time, but many, alas, not understanding the new danger, were not so fortunate, and died before they could get away. Some were overcome by the fumes and died almost at once. Some were captured, nearly all cough and spit blood, the chlorine attacking the mucous membrane. The dead were all turned black at once. The effect of this poisonous gas was felt over about six kilometers of ground in length by the French. Some of the soldiers that the chlorine gas was too much diluted with the air to kill, but suffocated many.

Political Life Sordid
Prof. Bland, Winnipeg, Scores Parties For Low Ideals.
Toronto Star.
In delivering the Victoria College baccalaureate sermon in Convocation Hall yesterday Prof. Salem Bland of Winnipeg said that the political life of Canada is the most sordid and the most destitute of moral ideas of all the English-speaking lands on the face of the earth. Continuing, he said that "if Sir Robert Borden lends himself to the sinister influences which unfortunately he has admitted into his cabinet, and springs an election upon Canada during the war, stirring up the passions of the Canadian people, making a harvest of recrimination and dividing the men in the battlefield, then I say the reputation of Sir Robert Borden for patriotism and for statesmanship will suffer considerably. When charges are made of broken faith, abuse of patronage, and graft, there is no longer need for defence. Swift comes the reply 'You're another,' and then both political parties heave a sigh and settle down to the comfortable feeling that that matter is very decently to be done with."
"Our Canadian political life today it utterly unworthy of the best soul of the Canadian people—on both sides. I speak freely because, frankly, I have no faith in either political party under present leadership as a vehicle of expression of the best soul of the Canadian people. There might be some who promise a resurrection for one or the other of these political parties. Great is their faith. (Laughter).
Professor Bland, referring to those he termed "the most unscrupulous men in our political life to-day," declared that in no English land were there more clever and slippery schemers than in Canada.

Davis, Kingston, is a brother-in-law.
The funeral of the deceased was held on April 11th, at Emerson Cemetery.

Late Rev. E. S. Shorey.
On Monday night Rev. Edmund S. Shorey passed away at his late residence, Spynham, at the age of seventy-eight years and eleven months. The deceased was born at Centreville on May 4th 1836, and was the oldest son of the late Christopher Shorey. Forty years was devoted to the Methodist ministry. Big French Cruiser Was Torpedoed
It is Not Known How Many of the Crew Were Lost.
(Special to the Whig.)
Paris, April 28.—The big French armored cruiser Leon Gambetta of 12,352 tons displacement was torpedoed and sunk, presumably by an Austrian submarine, in the Adriatic, off Otranto. It is not known as yet how many of the crew were drowned but the Minister of Marine believes some were saved. The report of the sinking of the cruiser was contained in an official communique made public by the Minister of Marine. It stated that the warship was torpedoed on Monday night and that details were lacking.
The Gambetta was built at Brest in 1901. She carried a crew of 725 men and had a speed of 23 knots. Her armament consisted of four 7.6 inch, sixteen 4.5 guns.
