IS CHURCHILL BACK

OF THE MOVE TO FORCE THE DARDANELLES?

Some Gloomy Predictions Are Heard As To the Results of the Expedition Against the Turks.

London, April 30.—A warm controversy is being waged in political and newspaper circles as to whether the operations against the Dardanelles are of a major or minor character, and, incidentally, whether or not Winston Churchill is personally responsible for their having been undertaken.

It is remarked, as instance, that the editor of the Morning Post, which is Mr. Churchill's severest critic, is a particular friend of Lord Charles Bessborough, whose questions in Parliament first drew public attention to the discussion of the latest phases of the Dardanelles problem.

In some quarters here gloomy predictions are heard as to the results of the expedition. When, months ago, the first naval attack on the Dardanelles forts was made, the most optimistic statements were current in quarters which were supposed to derive their inspiration from the Admiralty.

It cannot be denied that keen disappointment was felt here when it became evident that the attempt to force the Dardanelles by the navy had to be deferred until the co-operation of the landing forces was possible, and perhaps this disappointment is reflected to some extent in the misgivings which are now felt regarding the present operations.

German Murders. The latest exploits of the gallant German navy reveal more clearly perhaps than any previous incidents, the nature of this war, the character of the Germans, and the spirit in which they are waging it.

Bethlehem Steel Earnings. New York, April 28.—It is estimated that the Bethlehem Steel Corporation in the current year will show at least 60 per cent. on its common stock.

N. Y. STANDARD OIL REPORT.

\$6,000,000 in Dividends Paid—Asserts \$102,024,542

New York, April 28.—The Standard Oil Company of New York reports total earnings of \$7,735,919 in the year ended December 31st, 1914, as compared with \$16,212,985 in the preceding twelve months.

The company's plants, real estate and ships are valued \$44,466,018, a gain of more than \$4,000,000 for the year.

Absorbed Bonds. New York, April 28.—Charles M. Pepper, former trade adviser, United States Department of State, says that since the beginning of the year investors in the United States have subscribed over \$50,000,000 worth of Canadian municipal and provincial loans.

Made Good Returns. New York, April 28.—Some authorities estimate that American Ice is in line this year to show profits of from 12 per cent. to 15 per cent. on its \$14,900,000 preferred against a dividend balance for the fiscal year to Oct. 31st last of about 2 1/2 per cent.

Commercial Notes. Dominion Linens, Limited, operating mills at Guelph and Tilsonburg, earned at the rate of ten per cent. on its preferred stock last year.

Small Canadian Issue Placed. London, April 28.—Two Colonies Governments are now in the market for money. Victoria is issuing \$1,250,000 4-1/2 per cent. bonds at par redeemable in 1925 or at government option 1920.

Diversified Farming. Chicago, April 28.—A paper quotes Sir Donald Mann as saying that Canada will diversify crops this year more than ever before.

The Grand Trunk during its last fiscal year carried 12,781,000 passengers, as compared with 12,852,551 in 1913—a decrease of 1,071,551. The company carried 21,472,864 tons of freight, and live stock in 1914, as against 22,594,960 in 1913—a decrease of 2,421,096.

New Farming Company. Ottawa, April 28.—The Dominion Farming Company has been formed for the purpose of acquiring and developing western farm lands situated at Bassano and Beaufield, Alberta.

A SKIRT THAT PLEASURES

Four-piece skirt in broadcloth for misses and small women. The notched yoke strikes a decidedly new note in hip trimming.

Here is a new model for a separate skirt that has sprung into instant favor. It is a four-piece affair with a two-piece yoke, pointed at the side where the adjustment is effected.

To make the design one will need 2 1/2 yards of 54-inch or 3 1/2 yards of 44-inch material.

The home dressmaker who has had but very little experience can develop this skirt very successfully. Using 54-inch goods, first fold it, then arrange on the fold the side gore.

Now fold the material again, making a quarter, instead of a half fold as in the first instance, and along the lengthwise fold place the front gore, also front yoke. Along the opposite edge arrange the back gore and back yoke.

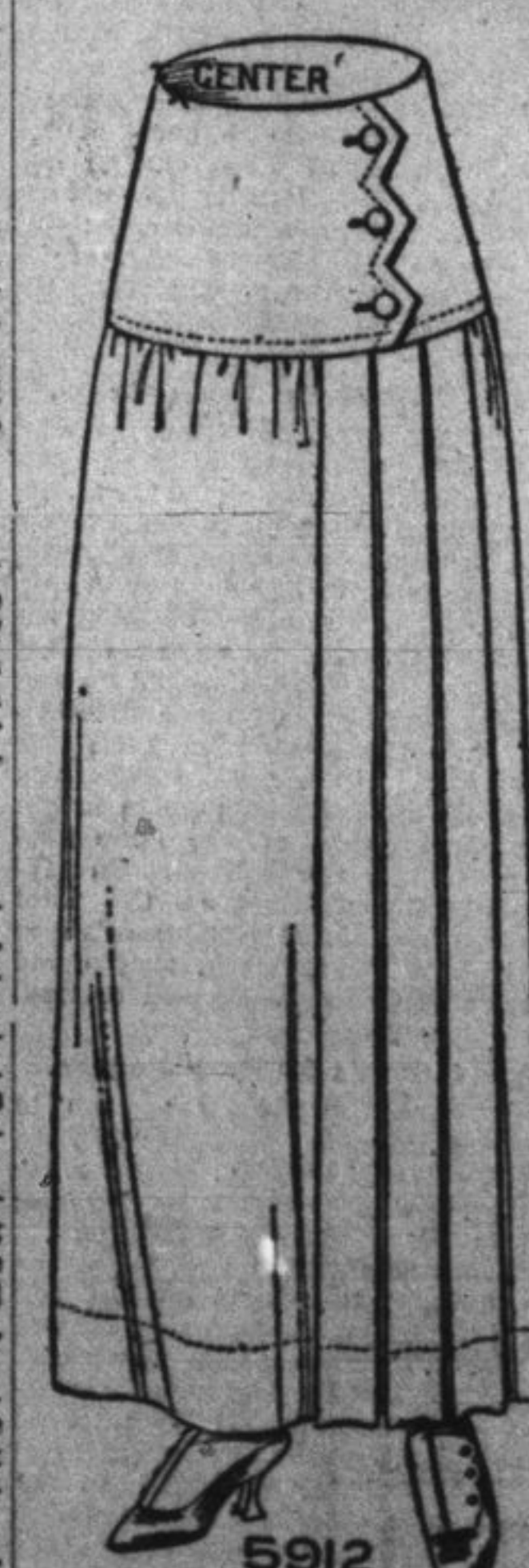
To make, join the gores, then form box pleats and gather upper edge along double "T" perforations.

For the yoke, first underface side edge of front. Then turn under lower edges of yokes on small "o" perforations, lap front yoke on back, matching corresponding single small "o" perforations and stitch, leaving edges (on left side) free for opening.

Lap lower folded edge of yoke on gores, notches, centers and edges underneath even and stitch in tuck effect. Adjust a webbing or a straight strip of canvas two inches wide to position underneath upper edge of skirt for a stay; stitch upper edges together.

The buttons should be as plain as possible to conform to the simplicity of the design.
