GERMANY HAS LOST Seventeen Submarines Since the 16th of February. (Special to the Whig.) Copenhagen, May 20.—Couriers from Germany say it is generally believed that the Kaiser has lost seventeen submarines all told in the British blockade, since February 15th.

RESIGNATIONS HANDED IN To Permit of Reconstruction of British Cabinet. (Special to the Whig.) London, May 20.—It is believed here this afternoon that Lord Kitchener and all other Cabinet ministers have handed in their resignations to Premier Asquith to permit of a thorough reconstruction.

Removed Christ To Crucify Canadian London, May 20.—In the House of Commons yesterday Harold J. Tennant, Parliamentary Under-Secretary for War, announced that the Government was inquiring into the allegation that Germans had removed the figure of Christ from a large village crucifix and fastened a wounded Canadian sergeant to the cross. Mr. Tennant said his inquiry had not been completed.
