TO BE HELD AT FORT

BECAUSE HE DID NOT CONCEAL PRO-GERMAN VIEWS.

S. H. Mundheim Held the Rank of Captain in the Kaiser's Army--In Canada Fifteen Years.

A German who held the rank of captain in the Kaiser's army is to be interned at Fort Henry.

Word was received from Montreal on Friday that S. H. Mundheim, general manager of the Cement Produce Company of Canada, had been taken in charge and would be brought to Fort Henry.

He was arrested at the opening of the war, but was released. He was taken into custody by officers of the Enemy Aliens Department, and will be interned probably until the war is ended.

Mundheim, who resided in Quebec, in close proximity to the company's extensive plant on the island of Orleans, has never concealed his pro-German views.

He is a German by birth, and his name is well known in the province, but last Monday orders were received here from the Dominion police at Ottawa that Mundheim was to be arrested.

Mundheim had on his person his German passport, showing that he held, or had held, the rank of captain in the Kaiser's army.
