

IN THUNDERSTORMS.

What to Do, and What Not to Do In Order To Be Safe,

To take shelter during a thunderfer an onen shed or barn, or to be the most prominent object in a field of this danger, but the warning is often ignored.

As the eminent scientists, Sir Ray Lankester, who says that all children should be warned against seeking shelter in a thunderstorm under any solitary upstanding shed, tree, or group of trees, points out, such danger can, to a large extent, be avoided if people will only behave in accordance with the dictates of knowledge and experience. 


