APPOINT ADMIRAL JACKSON

Succeeds Lord Fisher at the Admiralty.

London, May 29.—Admiral Sir Henry Bradwardine Jackson has been appointed First Sea Lord of the Admiralty to take the place of Admiral Lord Fisher, who resigned.

Sir Henry Jackson has held the position of chief of the war staff in the Admiralty since 1912, and commander-in-chief of the Mediterranean fleet since last year. He is just 50 years of age, and has been in the navy for 47 years.
