He has instilled into the minds of millions of his countrymen dangerous economic fallacies, his agitations and his ambitions have disturbed industry and inflicted great loss upon the country. His impro-priety of behavior and the lack of dignity he has shown in the office of Secretary of State have been a public humiliation, and, playing the part of a vulgar spollsman, he has done what he could to impair the efficiency of a great department of the Govern-ment by displacing men of ability and training to make room for obscure and incapable persons who have done him political service. By turns he has aroused feelings of disgust, contempt, of aversion and of unspeakable weariness. Should he persist in his attempt to obstruct or defeat the policies of the President by persuading those who still may be his followers to take the German view that the murder of peaceful American citizens is a legitimate operation of war, should he continue to act upon the theory that his selfish personal or political ends may be prudently, safely, or honorably gained by counseling the abandonment of American rights and disloyalty to the American Government, he is making the greatest mistake of a life abounding in mistakes and the teast of any public concern which it will be in his power to make.
