IN MARINE CIRCLES.

Movements of Vessels Reported Along the Harbor.

The steamer Stanstead is due to arrive at Richardson's elevator, tonight or tomorrow, with a cargo of oats, which will be bagged and sent on to Montreal, for shipment to the British army.

The steamer Jex arrived in port early on Wednesday morning from Oswego with coal for Robert Crawford. The Jex made an exceptionally quick trip this time, she having cleared for Oswego at noon on Tuesday; and at that the steamer had a bad storm to break through both ways.

M. T. Co.'s Bulletin: Tug Emerson arrived from Port Dalhousie with the barge Hamilton, grain-laden, and cleared for Montreal.

As the steamer Castanet, on its first trip of the season, with about one hundred passengers aboard, was running through the narrow channel between Rose Island and the Linden Hof, near Point St-Vincent, on Sunday, she ran aground, because of the low water, losing one of the wheels and suffering a broken shaft. The passengers were removed in power boats and in row boats, and the steamer Island Wanderer later towed the Castanet to Alexandria Bay.

Steamer Belleville down Wednesday morning; steamer Calgarian down 2.30 a.m. Wednesday; steamer Iroquois down 5.30 a.m. Wednesday.

Steamers Arabian and Fairfax are expected down Wednesday night.

Steamer Alexandria is getting ready to start on her route by July 1st. She has been taken from her winter quarters near the Forwarders' elevator, and is at present lying at Swift's wharf.
