London, June 16.—Dr. Ambrose Quatborough, a member of the House of Keys, the governing parliament of the Isle of Man, gave notice at the next meeting he would move that the English Government be asked to annex the island. He complained that the Isle of Man could not get needed reforms, and that the government had relapsed into a 'one man power.'

Peace Conference Proposed

Washington, June 16.—A petition addressed to the United States and other neutral nations by a number of prominent American business men, suggesting a peace conference by representatives of neutral and belligerent nations has been received by President Wilson. It is proposed that the conference be organized before July 15th and remain in session until a final peace meeting between the belligerent countries is agreed on, offering from time to time suggestions to the belligerents as to ways of ending the war. Former Representative Calder of New York forwarded the petition.
