OBITUARY

REV. DR. BAYLES DEAD. Was Secretary of Synod of the Diocese of Montreal.

Montreal, June 22.—Rev. J. Gilbert Baylis, D.D., Canon of Christ Church Cathedral, this city, and Secretary of the Synod of the Diocese of Montreal, died Monday afternoon at his residence, 449 University street.

Canon Baylis was born in London, England, seventy-six years ago, and came to Canada about sixty years ago. His first ministerial work was as pastor of the Congregational Church at St. John, N. B. Some years ago he withdrew from the Congregational body and joined the Church of England.

London, June 22.—According to the South Wales Daily News, Honar Law, with the late Dr. William Jacks, founded the Glasgow firm of which two members were sentenced the other day for trading with the enemy. WHAT HE THINKS. Germans Demoralized Belief Of Sir Richard.

New York, June 22.—"I have been close enough to the front to be able to state positively that the Germans are demoralized and discouraged."

There is no question of the outcome of the war," he added, "and the Allied troops are supremely confident. There are many Americans with the Canadian contingent and they are fighting splendidly. A number of them already have won commissions for their bravery and resource."

Sir Richard said he had visited every hospital in France and praised highly the efficiency of the American Red Cross contingent.

ZEPPELIN CAUGHT FIRE

And Fell into the Sea Near Zebruggen. (Special to the Whig.) Amsterdam, June 22.—Advices from Flushing-to-day said that a Zeppelin caught fire in the vicinity of Zebruggen during the night and fell into the sea.

Canadian Steamer Sunk. (Special to the Whig.) London, June 22.—The Canadian liner Caribrook, from Montreal, has been sunk by German submarines.

The steamer Caribrook was a freighter, and sailed from Montreal on June 5th with a cargo of over 100,000 bushels of grain. She was in command of Capt. D. A. Hunter.

The owners had not yet received direct word of the disaster. The steamer carried neither soldiers nor munitions.

RAISULIA IS FRIED UPON. Spanish Troops Ignore Safe Conduct Granted Moroccan Chief.

Madrid, June 22.—Raisuli, brigand and pretender to Morocco's throne, had another narrow escape from death, according to the Herold, when ten members of his suite were killed by the fire of Spanish troops near Arzulla, a Moroccan seaport.

Desiring to visit the region he formerly controlled, Raisuli asked General Marina, Military Governor of the Spanish zone, for a safe conduct, and his request was granted. Accompanied by forty native notables, he was on his way toward Arzulla when a brisk fusillade was opened by a detachment of troops.

Only the swiftness of his horse saved Raisuli.

An inquiry begun by the military authorities has not revealed whether General Marina's order regarding a safe conduct for Raisuli was not received, or whether it was misunderstood. Several junior officers have been arrested, and an effort will be made to fix responsibility for the attack.

German Spy To Die. London, June 22.—Muller, a convicted German spy, who was arrested while near Koenigsberg, Prussia, his appeal was dismissed to-day.
