The Relief Committee of the Kingston branch of the Canadian Patriotic Fund will meet Friday afternoon at four o'clock, in the Board of Trade rooms, to pass the allowances for the month.

Sergeant-Inst. Brown, R.C.H.A., returned from Toronto on Wednesday where he has been for the last week on a recruiting trip for "C" Battery. He reports that recruits are becoming harder than ever to secure.

Those who object to the form of the ballot used to decide whether we should have a Utilities Commission or not are reminded that it was prepared by the Finance Committee of which the Mayor is the chairman. It should have been right.

The militia authorities will not put on extra guards at the Armouries, Kingston drydock, and elsewhere in the city as a precaution against an outrage here similar to the one in Windsor on Tuesday. The present strength is considered quite sufficient.

The Niagara District Baseball League is no more. Port Colborne imported players from Buffalo and that caused St. Catharines to object to that team remaining. Disagreement spread until yesterday President Robertson announced that the league was at an end.

Speaking about "Scotty" Davidson, the Toronto News says: "Notwithstanding the fact that the call for the First Canadian Contingent came just at the beginning of the hockey season last year and when the Kingston boy could have had a contract for any salary within reason, he was one of the first to enlist."

The efforts of the past few years to bring lacrosse back into its own are now being felt. Those who did missionary work in the districts where the game had died out and induced the younger element to take up the game are seeing the results of their efforts. Not only has the interest increased, but the players have learned the art of the game, and superior lacrosse is the order.

Montreal Herald: Details received in Toronto about the reported death of Allan Davidson, the former crack forward of the Toronto hockey team, show that the big fellow was a game inmate in fighting the Germans as he was in battling opponents on the ice. Throughout the war, Davidson had been noted for his dashing bravery and daring.

The first horse-racing meeting of the German season, which was held on May 24th at Hoppegarten, took place under peculiar conditions. The owners, trainers and jockeys for the most part turned out in their gray field uniforms.

Dr. M. M. Crawford, Toronto, has received a letter from "Charlie" Gage, the well known Varsity Rugby captain, who is away with the Second Canadian Contingent. Up to the time of writing Gage had not reached the front, and was expected to be sent at any time. During the voyage over Gage won the boxing championship, and also the long jump, the second place in the jump being taken by Ross Laing, the star Rugby player at McGill.

Found Dead at Greenbush.
 Brockville, June 24.—David Murphy, aged about eighty years, was found dead on Tuesday last on the premises of his nephew, William Tackaberry, Greenbush. Later he was found lying beside a fence on the premises of a short distance from the house. Life was extinct. He was well known throughout Leeds as a cheese-maker. He was born at Pine Hill, and was unmarried.

Montreal Doctor Interned.
 Montreal, June 24.—Dr. Oliver Meany, claimed by the officials of the Allen Enemy Department to be an Austrian, but who contended that he is a Roumanian, has been interned. The officials say that the doctor tried to enlist in the Army Medical Corps at Winnipeg and Ottawa, and that he wrote the Austrian Ambassador at Washington offering his services as a doctor.

William Walker, Sidney township, died on Wednesday, aged seventy-nine years. He was a Methodist. Two sons and one daughter survive. It is understood the Government will lease the Lake Superior section of the G.T.P. on the basis of \$600,000 annual rental.

Berlin Regrets Attack.
 Stockholm, June 24.—Official announcement was made that the German Government had expressed deep regret for the attack of Christiansaund on June 15 on the Swedish steamer Verdan. Germany declares the attack on the Verdan, which was torpedoed by a submarine and then shelled by a cruiser, was a mistake and expressed willingness to pay indemnity. The Verdan was bound for England with a cargo of wood.
