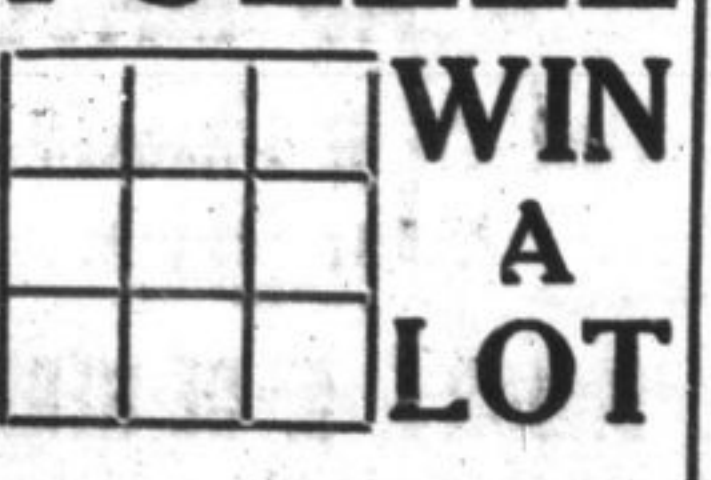
ROBERT W. SERVICE Canadian poet, travelling in the war zone at the outbreak of war in new driving a motor transport in the French army.
