Major Melghem, who has been invalided home from the front, and is now in Montreal, will give a series of lectures in the different camps throughout the country. It is expected that he will come to Barriefield in the near future.

Major-General L. Lessard, Inspector-General of the Eastern Forces, will arrive in camp in about a month for an inspection.

WENT TO BARRIEFIELD TO "DIG IN" GUNS.

Tactical Scheme Mapped Out—Lieut. Forte, Halifax, Has Been Attached To "C" Battery, R. C. H. A.

At nine o'clock on Wednesday morning, "C" Battery, R. C. H. A., accompanied by the fifteen cadets who will take artillery commissions this year, paraded to Barriefield.

The scheme to be worked out is as follows: The battery was supposed to be moving from Belleville to Gananoque, when a message reaches the officers while they are at Kingston that their scouts are being held up somewhere in the vicinity of Dunlop's farm, on the Gananoque road.

The men were set to work to dig trenches for the guns and wagons, and the horses were taken to a position in the rear.

The work as planned was for the instruction of the cadets as well as the artillerymen, and should prove very interesting. Dinner was served at noon, and the battery was expected back in the city on Wednesday evening.

Paris, July 7.—That Germany has constructed thousands of aluminum boats of special design for an invasion of England by the assertion made by Commandant Civrix, military critic of the Matin.
