## HARRYING THE TURKS

EXCITING WORK HAS BEEN GO-ING ON IN EGYPT.

British Lieutenant Invalided Home Tells of Adventures of Territorials In the Desert Along With Australians, New Zealanders and Ceylon Tea Planters-"Made In Germany" Pontoons Captured.

Somewhere in Egypt are Dragoons of Westminster, Yeomanry of Hertford, and Territorials of East Laneashire, who went out in September last and have since had waried and exciting experiences on

News of their doings is brought home by Lieutenant Oswald Lewis, who is back on sick leave, laid up with sciatica.

Mr. Lewis is a prospective member of Parliament; he won a seat on the Marylebone Borough Council when he came of age, being then the youngest borough councillor in the whole of London; he was afterwards elected to the London County Council; and he has earned great popularity in North Dorset where he is seeking Parliamentary honors.



Either of the three models can be put together very quickly. The first, for instance, is pleated at the shoulder, placing "T" on small "o" perforations, after which it is tacked. Close underarm and shoulder seams, then finish as preferred.

For bolero No. 2 close under-arm and shoulder seams as notched, then turn hem in front on double "oo" perforations, Gather lower edge between double "TT" perforations. Center-front indicated by large "O" perforations. Turn hem in belt at notches. Centerfront indicated by double "oo" perforations. Sew to front and back as notched, centers even, large "O" perforation at under-arm seam.

If desired in suspender effect cut edges of front and back on single small "o" perforations. The lower edge of belt may be cut off on single small "o"

### Byron's Frugal Diet.

Byron was an exception to the rule that authorship and hearty feeding go together. For the poet had a morbid dread of getting stout, and Trelawny has recorded of him that he was the only human being enough not to grow fat.

In 1813, in the exercise of this self-restraint he lived on six biscuits a day and no drink but tea, fasting on occasions for 48 hours. Three years later he tried one thin slice of oread for breakfast and a vegetable dinner, and kept down his hunger in between by chewing tobacco.

And though this semi-starvation may have been bad in the long run, a visitor at the time could only observe that no man had brighter eyes or a clearer voice.

Each stays as long as his fame endures. Nobody remembers when Shakespeare was not in the exhibition. Doctoring Dreadnoughts.

After the conflict, Jack Tars have several methods of stopping the incoming water when a battleship has been hit below the water-line. For instance, if a small hole has been made in the vessel's side, an apparatus like an umbrella is used. This is thrust through the hole, point first, and then drawn back so that it will open like an umbrella, leav-

ing the canvas outside. Of course, the pressure of the water effectually forces the canvas against the ship's side, thus stopping the leak; but to make it more secure the handle of the umbrella, which is formed like a screw, is fastened by a nut inside.

Australia's Trade Drops.

The total imports of merchandise into the Union of South Africa during 1914 were valued at \$156,612, compared with \$192,631,900 for 1913. The largest decrease was in imports of articles of food and drink, of which the values were \$30,000,000 and \$35,000,000 respectively. Exports decreased from \$325,573,000 in 1913 to \$192,475,-000 in 1914. This large drop is accountable for principally by the stoppage of the export of gold and diamonds, the value of the former be ing \$187,000,0000 in 1913, compared with \$102,000,000 in 1914, and the latter \$60,000,000 and \$27,000,000 respectively.

To Conserve Ruins, The most interesting of the arch-seological works lately taken in hand at Delhi is the conservation of the ruins known as the Kotila, or citadel of Firozeabad, the city built in the early part of the 15th century by the Pathan Firezeahah. These ruins contain the pillar of Asoka some twenty centuries old which was brought from its site in the Siwalik hills by Firozeshah in 1357 and set-up by him on a high base consisting of a treble series of arches.
