HARRYING THE TURKS

EXCITING WORK HAS BEEN GOING ON IN EGYPT.

British Lieutenant Invalided Home Tells of Adventures of Territorial in the Desert Along With Australians, New Zealanders and Ceylon Tea Planters—"Made in Germany" Pontoons Captured.

Somewhere in Egypt are Dragoons of Westminster, Yeomanry of Hertford, and Territorials of East Lancashire, who went out in September last and have since had varied and exciting experiences on active service.

News of their doings is brought home by Lieutenant Oswald Lewis, who is back on sick leave, laid up with sciatica. Mr. Lewis is a prospective member of Parliament; he won a seat on the Marylebone Borough Council when he came of age, being then the youngest borough councillor in the whole of London; he was afterwards elected to the London County Council; and he has earned great popularity in North Dorset where he is seeking Parliamentary honors.

When the war broke out all the officers in the Westminster Dragoons volunteered for foreign service. Mr. Lewis being amongst them; and 80 recruits of the men followed suit. Lewis being enlisted to bring the numbers up to the full complement. "It was in October that we landed at Alexandria," said Lieut. Lewis, and, with the East Lancashire Territorials and the Hertford Yeomanry, we went on to Cairo, where we took part in the ceremonies that attended the coming of the new Sultan. Then we were stationed at Abbasiya; the two Yeomanry regiments replaced the 3rd Dragoon Guards, who had moved to France, and we remained there on garrison duty during the winter.

"It was right on the desert," remarked Lieut. Lewis, "but the facilities for training were admirable, and the health of the troops was good, on the whole. "We were joined by the Australians and the New Zealanders, and afterwards the Ceylon tea planters sent a party, which became practically an "old" training corps; whilst we also made acquaintance with the Maoris, who were particularly friendly with the New Zealanders.

"At the beginning of February the Turks made their first serious attack on the Suez Canal, where Indian troops had been joined by artillery from the Lancashire Division, the Egyptian Artillery being also there.

"We were moved up to Ismailia, and during the two days we stayed there we could see the night rockets fired from the enemy's trenches. When the Turks retired we followed them something like 15 miles into the Sinai Peninsula, crossing the canal on pontoons.

"Something like 27 pontoons were seized by the British, these having been abandoned by the Turks, who had brought them across the desert; and inasmuch as the boats were unscratched it is to be inferred that they must have been carried by the enemy on their march. That was no trifling task, seeing that each pontoon would hold about 20 men. Though they bore the name of Constantinolesse pontoons were obviously of German make.

"Indian cavalry and camel corps also joined in the advance into the Sinai Peninsula. We got a few stragglers. Some prisoners taken by patrols were manifestly suffering from lack of food and dispirited after defeat; and it was suggested that a number had probably deserted.

"It was heavy going over the shifting sand into the desert, and very trying to the horses.

"The Turks had retired apparently in good order, but abandoned ammunition lying along the track showed that they had made a hasty retreat. It was significant that the cartridges found included a number of the latest German type, the bullet with pointed ends. Swords and rifles were picked up; and along the line were oxen and camels which had fallen out and died of exhaustion. Not only were the Turks pressed for time, but I should imagine that they were very short of water. It was a dreary waste through which they had ventured—absolutely destitute of a blade of grass or a green tree; nothing but sand.

"We had a long day and got back to the canal the next night, and we stayed in the district for some weeks scouting around. We bivouacked in the desert on the African side of the canal, finding it very hot by day and very cold at night, with heavy dew at early morning. By and by we returned to our quarters at Abbasiya."

The bolero is the big idea in the spring woman's wardrobe, for it is being planned in many wonderful ways for spring and summer use. Five different models are suggested here, suitable to development in as many different materials. The center design, however, is carried out in plain broadcloth trimmed with braid. In white or a neutral color it will go well with almost any simple frock. For medium size about 1 yard of 28-inch material is required.

For summer frocks Model No. 1 is very pretty made of embroidery douching or lace. Frequently it is possible to get these trimmings only 18 inches wide, in which event 1 3/4 yards of material will be needed.

Bolero No. 2 can be made in suspender effect, if preferred, and is illustrated.

History in Wax Figures. At an average rate of one model per fortnight I must have turned a round thousand in my time, some in wax, some in plaster, others at comparative leisure, being less meteoric and of more abiding interest—royalties, for example, and men of letters, or great soldiers like Gordon, Wolsey and Roberts. Each stays as long as his fame endures. Nobody remembers when Shakespeare was not in the exhibition. Voltaire is its oldest inhabitant, and five generations have now passed before the figure of this revolutionary. The most notorious leaders of the French Revolution are there, as, of course, the exhibition was transferred from Paris to London over 100 years ago.

It was in 1802 that madame came to London, having lived in Paris through the whole of the French Revolution. Frequently had her art been requisitioned to mold the head of some sanguinary monster or other, Robespierre, Danton and Marat among the number. The cast of the most notorious of this trio, still in the exhibition, was taken by Mme. Tussaud at the scene of the murder, and later she made a cast of the once beautiful face of his assassin, Charlotte Corday. Madame came to London alone, leaving her husband, Francois Tussaud, in Paris. After nearly half a century of peaceful and prosperous years in England, she died in 1850, in her ninety-first year.—John Theodore Tussaud in London Strand Magazine.

Doctoring Dreadnoughts. After the conflict, Jack Tars have several methods of stopping the incoming water when a battleship has been hit below the water-line. For instance, if a small hole has been made in the vessel's side, an apparatus like an umbrella is used. This is thrust through the hole, point first, and then drawn back so that it will open like an umbrella, leaving the canvas outside.

Of course, the pressure of the water continually forces the canvas against the ship's side, thus stopping the leak; but to make it more secure the handle of the umbrella, which is formed like a screw, is fastened by a nut inside.

Australia's Trade Drops. The total imports of merchandise into the Union of South Africa during 1914 were valued at \$156,612,500 compared with \$192,631,900 for 1913. The largest decrease was in imports of articles of food and drink, of which the values were \$30,000,000 and \$35,000,000 respectively. Exports decreased from \$325,573,000 in 1913 to \$192,475,000 in 1914. This large drop is accountable for principally by the stoppage of the export of gold and diamonds, the value of the former being \$187,000,000 in 1913, compared with \$102,000,000 in 1914, and the latter \$60,000,000 and \$27,000,000 respectively.

To Conserve Ruins. The most interesting of the archaeological works lately taken in hand at Delhi is the conservation of the ruins known as the Kotla, or Citadel of Ferozshah, the city built in the early part of the 15th century by the Pathan Ferozshah. These ruins contain the pillar of Asoka some twenty centuries old which was brought from its site in the Siwalik hills by Ferozshah in 1357 and set up by him on a high base consisting of a triple series of arches.
