The following report regarding sanitary inspection was presented by Inspector Timmerman and Police Constable James Craig:

"We beg leave to report for your information that we have finished our annual sanitary inspection, and visited 5,092 houses. We found on the south side of Princess street 142 and on the north side 250 yards, in all 392. There were also on the south side 37 and on north side 34 dirty cellars, in all 71 This was at-the time of our inspection, but they are now mostly all

"We notified 142 people to have the stable manure kept in a tight covered box while it remains on their


