The penitentiary authorities have been steadily earrying out the recommendations made at the Commission some time ago and great improvements have resulted.

In a little colony like the penitentiary which is so snut away from the world new brains are necessary to suggest improvements, and for this reason suggestions from outside sources are carried out to the great benefit to the institution. The public do not realize the changes but the prisoners and the officers do. A small matter, which means a great deal to the convicts, has been the issuing of a tooth-brush to every man. A few years ago this idea was unheard of. Another improvement is the discarding of tin plates and cups and use of enamel ware. This has been found much more sanitary and although there was little expense in the change it has brought about a great improvement in the spirit of the convicts.
