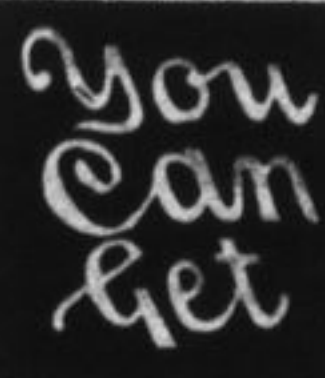

The inquiry will be conducted by Capt. Demers, Dominion Wreck Commissioner, who is at present at Quebec but will go to Toronto shortly.

WRECKAGE PILED HIGH. Twenty-seven Bodies Found in Storm Ruins. Erie, Pa., Aug. 5.—Erie had counted twenty-seven of her dead when darkness last night drew a blanket over the mile-long wreckage-strewn path in the heart of the city followed by last night's flood. But little impression was made on this vast amount of wreckage, piled in places 100 feet high, and others to be piled by the coroner and others to conceal as many more victims. Work of recovering all will be slow. The property loss, early estimated at \$3,000,000, was not changed by Fire Chief McMahon after he had received reports from big manufacturing plants in the flood zone. He estimated that 200 houses and fifty store buildings were laid low by the waters of Mill Creek sent out of its banks by a cloud-burst and the bursting of the Clearwood dam. The city's loss on damaged culverts, bridges and water supply plant will be heavy.

Eager To Go Forward. By a letter received by D. P. Branigan, manager of the Grand Opera House, on Wednesday from Corporal H. Thompson, a former stage employee, it is quite evident that the 21st Battalion, which left here a few months ago is waiting with all eagerness to go to the front. In part, this letter states: "We have in our camp at the present time the 18th Battalion, London; 19th and 20th Toronto and ourselves from Kingston. We are brigaded together and will leave very soon for the front. "The boys of this brigade are becoming very impatient to get away. God help the Germans if this bunch ever get hold of them. Our time is getting very short in England now, and the sooner the better. "I had six days leave of absence to visit Manchester, my old home town, but there was certainly a great change. "Everyone is in splendid health. Our camp is close to the Flying Corps Headquarters and the aeroplanes are so high that we do not have to pay a quarter to see them."

He poured from one pound to a gallon of cold water in a solution of ammonium phosphate. Then he took an eight-inch strip of ordinary cotton gauze and dipped it in the ammonium phosphate solution. He dried it with an electric fan and held it in a flame for thirty seconds, but it did not burn. He took another strip of gauze that had not been treated with the solution and on igniting it it burned in four seconds. He advised that the whole family wardrobe should be made fireproof. The expense for an average-size family would be 15 cents a week.
